

PRESS RELEASE: MONUMENTAL I GROUP EXHIBITION Featuring: Matt Kleberg, Skeet McAuley, John Pomara, Allison V. Smith, Ann Stautberg, Lorraine Tady, Liz Trosper, and Randy Twaddle. January 26 - March 16, 2019

This exhibition is the first in a two part series addressing the theme of the monumental. Works included in this installment will feature works using a two-dimensional approach; the second installment, opening this spring, will feature three-dimensional works.

The Artist says...

In "Octagon Vibration Series, Open Cloud Lorrie, Cliffs of Dover", the recognition of a digital world is evidenced by the straight "cut and paste" image edges occasionally seen in the image.

The process of digital and analog printing, altering, re-inventing and re-digitizing my source includes the fluorescent highlighter, often used for tracking or marking of lists, whether digital or analog.

This work draws from Tady's travels as well, referencing Dover, one of the largest ports in the world. The painting also references the modes of transportation in near the Cliffs of Dover, a place of enigmatic light and vast spatial distances of landscape and seascape.

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
